





Giving for the Future

Planned Giving

Planned giving means making regular donations to the parish. You can set this up as you like - it does not need to be weekly - it could be monthly for example.

We recommend **Standing Orders**, at intervals of your choice, from your Bank to the Parish. Please ask for a form from Church.

Occasional Giving

As well as planned giving, you may wish to give occasional amounts for special appeals and events, including second collections, to the parish and outside charities. Again, special envelopes can be used, but we recommend the Digital Collection Plate in Church and at cannock.mydona.com You can make donations in Church (by card, contactless or chip and pin) or online, wherever you may be.

Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer you can Gift Aid the tax you have paid, back to the parish. This means that for every £10 you give, the government will add a further £2.50. Only a small amount of paperwork is necessary. You can register for Gift Aid when you make a donation at cannock.mydona.com, or with a form available from Church.

Cashless collections

It would be a great help to the Parish if most parishioners paid your collection money by Standing Order. The Bank now charges us for paying in cash, while standing orders, especially with Gift Aid, bring extra, and regular, money into the parish.

Please pick up a copy of a form from church and return it complete with your details.

Please register your card for Gift Aid

Go to cannock.mydona.com on your Internet connected device, (phone, tablet, laptop etc) and make a donation. Choose to Gift Aid it, and fill in the short form. The card you use will then be registered for gift aid, and all future donations to the parish using this card (online or in Church) will be increased by 25% by the taxman.

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel (21 C)

"Men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God." (Luke 13:29) When Jesus first spoke these words, his followers were few in number. They were not respected or admired by the powerful. In fact, they lived under suspicion. The Jewish leaders were uneasy, the Roman authorities cautious, and soon enough the early

Church found itself mocked, rejected, and persecuted.

And yet in that fragile beginning there was this extraordinary hope – that God's kingdom would not be a narrow or exclusive place, but a great feast open to people of every nation. From the beginning, Jesus' vision was of a worldwide family gathered around the table of the Lord.

We read this Gospel today with centuries of hindsight. We know the story of the Church spreading far beyond the hills of Galilee and the streets of Jerusalem.

Think of St Francis Xavier arriving in India and Japan with hardly anything but zeal.

Think of St Charles Lwanga and his companions in Uganda, giving their lives rather than renounce their faith.

Think of St Rose of Lima in Peru, whose holiness shone like a light in her city. Even

across England, where once Catholics were persecuted, and Priests like Blessed John Sugar were executed, in time a churches were built, parishes and schools were founded, and faith

was passed on. Jesus' vision has come true: men and women from east and west, north and south, have found their place at the banquet of the kingdom.

But today the Gospel challenges us in a different way. We no longer face outright persecution in this country. Instead, we face something perhaps harder to resist: indifference. People shrug at faith. They treat the Gospel as a relic of the past.



Many who once practised drift away. We worry about declining numbers, empty pews, and fewer vocations to the priesthood.

And yet, compared to those early Christians, we have it easy. They were small communities scattered across the vast Roman world, separated by long distances, often despised by their neighbours. They had no security, no buildings, no money. But What they did have was hope – a hope rooted in the words of Jesus, a vision of God's kingdom, a certainty that their labour was not in vain.

That hope gave them courage. It kept them faithful when the odds were against them. And it carried the Gospel across oceans and continents, from culture to culture, until it reached us.

That same hope must be ours today. The Gospel is not a thing of the past, nor is the Church a dying institution. Christ has promised that people from every land will gather at his feast. It is our task to live by that vision, to hand it on, to keep the flame burning in our time and place.

So let us not be discouraged. Let us not measure success by numbers or by popularity. Instead, let us measure by faithfulness: faithfulness in prayer, faithfulness in witness, faithfulness in hope. The kingdom of God is not built by human power but by divine grace. And Jesus assures us that grace will gather people from every nation into the joy of God's banquet.

They will indeed - because Jesus said so.

UN COURT CALLS FOR CLIMATE ACCOUNTABILITY

The International Court of Justice (ICJ), the UN's top court, has declared that wealthy nations must honor their international commitments to reduce pollution—or face potential compensation claims from countries suffering the worst effects of climate change. In a landmark advisory opinion, the ICJ emphasized the "urgent and existential threat" posed by climate change.

This ruling follows hearings requested by the UN General Assembly, which asked the ICJ to clarify nations' legal duties to curb greenhouse gas emissions and the consequences of failing to do so. The move was driven by developing countries and small island states, frustrated by the lack of progress under the 2015 Paris Agreement.

On 3 July, the Vatican instituted a new formulary for the Mass: Cardinal Czerny said "today we are happy to introduce a "Mass for the care of creation" (Missa pro custodia creationis), in response to requests suggested by Laudato si'." Pope Leo celebrated this Mass on 9th July.

We suggest that this Mass for the care of creation be celebrated in every parish, on September 1 or at some time during this Season.

Some politicians build their support on such ideas. Refugees seeking asylum, migrants seeking a better life, have a right to do so.


Our responsibility is to welcome such people, listen to their stories, and if they do have a claim to stay here, then we accept them.

Our Lady, Untier of Knots



The Devotion to Our Lady, Untier of Knots has its origins in 17th-century Germany, inspired by a painting, of which this is a simplified version - in the church of St. Peter am Perlach, in Augsburg, Bavaria.

It shows the Virgin Mary patiently untying a long, knotted ribbon - symbolising the difficulties and struggles of life.

The devotion is based on the confident belief that Mary, through her intercession, can untangle the "knots" of sin, conflict, and suffering.

The devotion gained worldwide popularity after Pope Francis, then a young Jesuit in Germany, encountered the image and later encouraged it in Argentina. It reflects trust in Mary's gentle help in resolving life's problems. Virgin Mary, Mother of fair love, Mother who never refuses to come to the aid of a child in need, Mother whose hands never cease to serve your beloved children because they are moved by the divine love and immense mercy that exist in your heart, cast your compassionate eyes upon me and see the snarl of knots that exists in my life. You know very well how desperate I am, my pain, and how I am bound by these knots.

Mary, Mother to whom God entrusted the undoing of the knots in the lives of his children, I entrust into your hands the ribbon of my life. No one, not even the Evil One himself, can take it away from your precious care. In your hands there is no knot that cannot be undone.

Powerful Mother, by your grace and intercessory power with Your Son and My Liberator, Jesus, take into your hands today this knot:

[Mention your petitions now]

I beg you to undo it for the glory of God, once and for all. You are my hope.

O my Lady, you are the only consolation God gives me, the fortification of my feeble strength, the enrichment of my destitution, and, with Christ, the freedom from my chains. Hear my plea. Keep me, guide me, protect me, O safe refuge!

Mary, Untier of Knots, pray for me.
