Giving for the Future

Planned Giving

Planned giving means making regular donations to the parish. You can set this up as you like - it does not need to be weekly - it could be monthly for example.

We recommend **Standing Orders**, at intervals of your choice, from your Bank to the Parish. Please ask for a form from Church.

Occasional Giving

As well as planned giving, you may wish to give occasional amounts for special appeals and events, including second collections, to the parish and outside charities. Again, special envelopes can be used, but we recommend the Digital Collection Plate in Church and at cannock.mydona.com You can make donations in Church (by card, contactless or chip and pin) or online, wherever you may be.

Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer you can Gift Aid the tax you have paid, back to the parish. This means that for every £10 you give, the government will add a further £2.50. Only a small amount of paperwork is necessary. You can register for Gift Aid when you make a donation at cannock.mydona.com, or with a form available from Church.

Cashless collections

It would be a great help to the Parish if most parishioners paid your collection money by Standing Order. The Bank now charges us for paying in cash, while standing orders, especially with Gift Aid, bring extra, and regular, money into the parish.

Please pick up a copy of a form from church and return it complete with your details.

Please register your card for Gift Aid

Go to **cannock.mydona.com** on your Internet connected device, (phone, tablet, laptop etc) and make a donation. Choose to Gift Aid it, and fill in the short form. The card you use will then be registered for gift aid, and all future donations to the parish using this card (online or in Church) will be increased by 25% by the taxman.



I therefore wanted to let you know about a group of people from all sides of the conflict who, even in these desperate times, are trying to bring people together in peace and harmony. The Rossing Centre

The Rossing Centre for Education and Dialogue is an interreligious organisation based in Jerusalem which promotes an inclusive society for all religious, ethnic and national groups. Through education, encounter, research and consulting, the Rossing Centre promotes better relations between Jews, Christians and Muslims in the Holy Land.

In line with our mission and theory of change, our activities are designed to foster the desire and build the capacity of Israelis and Palestinians, Jews, Christians and Muslims, to create inclusive, just societies for all. Our projects and programs fall under three main spheres of action:


- Our Education Department aims to enable the Israeli education system to educate the next generation of Jews and Arabs to develop open, pluralistic identities to be tolerant of difference and to be ready to live together and side by side in an inclusive society.
- Our Dialogue Department projects focus on engaging Jews and Arabs to act cohesively together to make the mixed spaces in which they live, work and study, shared and inclusive.
- Our International Engagement Department provides encounter, research and information services to local and international audiences. This enables the valuable exchange of ideas visà-vis effective peacebuilding between the Rossing Center and institutions and organisations in other countries – learning from each other's experiences and practices.

To date, we have collaborated with over 140 religious, interfaith, intercultural, educational and public bodies.

Reflection on the Sunday Gospel (19 C)

You must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect"

(Luke 12:40)

Jesus often takes us by surprise. He doesn't wrap the truth in cosy words. He tells it straight. And in today's Gospel, he compares his return to that of a thief in the night.

At first, that sounds

unsettling. Why would he compare himself to someone who comes to rob and steal, and invade our comfort?

If you've ever been robbed or burgled, or even had something go missing, you know the impact. It shakes your sense of safety. Your feel outraged that your own place had been violated. It makes you think differently about what really matters to you. And it usually makes you more watchful.



That's the point Jesus is making. When he comes to us – whenever that will be – he will take us by surprise. Unexpected. And we need to be ready. With our lamps lit.

Jesus will not spook us or scare us. He's not waiting to catch us out. He wants us to be ready. To live as people who expect to meet him – not just at the end of our lives, but in the middle of them. Whenever. In the people we speak to. In our compassion or generosity. In the way we treat strangers. In the times we spend – or don't spend – in prayer.

Its so easy to put these things off. We say: I'll pray more when life calms down. I'll go to Mass more often when things are easier. I'll sort things out when I'm older, or when I'm sick, or when I retire, when I move on. But that's like saying we'll lock the door when the horse has bolted, ... or after the burglar's helped himself.

The problem is not that we fall short – we all do – but that we make peace with falling short. We give up on change. We live with habits that numb us to God. And before long, we're spiritually asleep.

That's why Jesus tells these parables. He wants to wake us up.

The early Christians lived with this sense of readiness. They believed Jesus could return at any moment. And that shaped how they lived. They were generous, because they knew treasure in heaven mattered more than treasure on earth. They were prayerful, because they knew they needed God's grace daily. They were forgiving, because they knew the Lord would come to judge the living and the dead.

And what about us?

St Thérèse of Lisieux put it like this: "Miss no single opportunity of making some small sacrifice. Here, by a smiling look. There, by a kindly word. Always doing the smallest right and doing it all for love."



The Gospel today calls us to that kind of life – a life of watchfulness, not worry. Of readiness, not fear. Of being faithful, even when no one is watching.

Because if he comes today – and he can come today – we want to be found watching, not sleeping. Praying, not drifting. Loving, not waiting.

This Gospel isn't just about the end of the world. It's about today. It's about the moments when Christ knocks at the door of our heart: In the face of someone who needs help; In the quiet whisper of conscience; In the longing for something more.

"You also must be ready," Jesus tells us, "for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect" (Luke 12:40, ESV).

Let's not delay. Let's be ready - today.

UN COURT CALLS FOR CLIMATE ACCOUNTABILITY

The International Court of Justice (ICJ), the UN's top court, has declared that wealthy nations must honor their international commitments to reduce pollution—or face potential compensation claims from countries suffering the worst effects of climate change. In a landmark advisory opinion, the ICJ emphasized the "urgent and existential threat" posed by climate change.

This ruling follows hearings requested by the UN General Assembly, which asked the ICJ to clarify nations' legal duties to curb greenhouse gas emissions and the consequences of failing to do so. The move was driven by developing countries and small island states, frustrated by the lack of progress under the 2015 Paris Agreement.

Preparing for the Season of Creation

The Season of Creation is from 1 September to 4 October: please see the website: Seasonofcreation.org for details. The theme is "Peace with Justice".

On 3 July, the Vatican instituted a new formulary for the Mass: Cardinal Czerny said "today we are happy to introduce a "Mass for the care of creation" (Missa pro custodia creationis), in response to requests suggested by Laudato si'." Pope Leo celebrated this Mass on 9th July.

We suggest that this Mass for the care of creation be celebrated in every parish, on September 1 or at some time during this Season.

LIVE SIMPLY & SUSTAINABLY

For simple and sustainable school holiday activities, consider nature-based adventures like visiting local parks, observing nature around your home, or having a garden campout. Get creative with crafts using recycled materials. Explore free local resources like libraries and museums or get involved in community events such as the monthly 'Town Tidy'.

LIVE IN SOLIDARITY

Stories about Asylum seekers and migrants are frequently in the news, usually painted in negative light.

Some politicians and news channels, newspapers, social media outlets, use any negative story, sometimes fabricated, to argue that we should treat refugees harshly.

Some politicians build their support on such ideas. Refugees seeking asylum, migrants seeking a better life, have a right to do so.

Our responsibility is to welcome such people, listen to their stories, and if they do have a claim to stay here, then we accept them.

If not, then we help them to return to their homeland. At all times, we must treat them with respect and dignity.

Our Lady, Untier of Knots



The Devotion to Our Lady, Untier of Knots has its origins in 17th-century Germany, inspired by a painting, of which this is a simplified version - in the church of St. Peter am Perlach, in Augsburg, Bavaria.

It shows the Virgin Mary patiently untying a long, knotted ribbon - symbolising the difficulties and struggles of life.

The devotion is based on the confident belief that Mary, through her intercession, can untangle the "knots" of sin, conflict, and suffering.

The devotion gained worldwide popularity after Pope Francis, then a young Jesuit in Germany, encountered the image and later encouraged it in Argentina. It reflects trust in Mary's gentle help in resolving life's problems.

Virgin Mary, Mother of fair love, Mother who never refuses to come to the aid of a child in need, Mother whose hands never cease to serve your beloved children because they are moved by the divine love and immense mercy that exist in your heart, cast your compassionate eyes upon me and see the snarl of knots that exists in my life. You know very well how desperate I am, my pain, and how I am bound by these knots.

Mary, Mother to whom God entrusted the undoing of the knots in the lives of his children, I entrust into your hands the ribbon of my life. No one, not even the Evil One himself, can take it away from your precious care. In your hands there is no knot that cannot be undone.

Powerful Mother, by your grace and intercessory power with Your Son and My Liberator, Jesus, take into your hands today this knot:

[Mention your petitions now]

I beg you to undo it for the glory of God, once and for all. You are my hope.

O my Lady, you are the only consolation God gives me, the fortification of my feeble strength, the enrichment of my destitution, and, with Christ, the freedom from my chains. Hear my plea. Keep me, guide me, protect me, O safe refuge!

Mary, Untier of Knots, pray for me.
