Giving for the Future

Planned Giving

Planned giving means making regular donations to the parish. You can set this up as you like - it does not need to be weekly - it could be monthly for example.

We recommend **Standing Orders**, at intervals of your choice, from your Bank to the Parish. Please ask for a form from Church.

Occasional Giving

As well as planned giving, you may wish to give occasional amounts for special appeals and events, including second collections, to the parish and outside charities. Again, special envelopes can be used, but we recommend the Digital Collection Plate in Church and at cannock.mydona.com You can make donations in Church (by card, contactless or chip and pin) or online, wherever you may be.

Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer you can Gift Aid the tax you have paid, back to the parish. This means that for every £10 you give, the government will add a further £2.50. Only a small amount of paperwork is necessary. You can register for Gift Aid when you make a donation at <u>cannock.mydona.com</u>, or with a form available from Church.

Cashless collections

It would be a great help to the Parish if most parishioners paid your collection money by Standing Order. The Bank now charges us for paying in cash, while standing orders, especially with Gift Aid, bring extra, and regular, money into the parish.

Please pick up a copy of a form from church and return it complete with your details.

Please register your card for Gift Aid

Go to **cannock.mydona.com** on your Internet connected device, (phone, tablet, laptop etc) and make a donation. Choose to Gift Aid it, and fill in the short form. The card you use will then be registered gift aid, and all future donations to the parish using this card (online or in Church) will be increased by 25% by the taxman.

Getting to Know Pope Leo XIV

Biography of Pope Leo



Pope Leo XIV, born Robert Francis Prevost, became the 267th Pope after a life dedicated to pastoral service and leadership. Born in Chicago on September 14, 1955, he is of French, Italian, and Spanish descent, and has two brothers, Louis Martín and John Joseph. He joined the Augustinians in 1977. He was ordained a priest in Rome in 1982, before working in Peru.

For over a decade, Fr Bob (as he was known) served in Peruvian missions, supporting community projects, teaching theology, and caring pastorally for poor parishes.

Returning to the U.S., he became leader of the Augustinian Order worldwide for two terms. In 2014, Pope Francis appointed him bishop of Chiclayo and later Callao in Peru, while also contributing significantly to church administration and education in the region. He became a Peruvian citizen in 2015. His deep connection to Peru, particularly through his missionary work and leadership in Chiclayo, has led many Peruvians to regard him as one of their own.

Bishop Robert was called to Rome in 2023 as Prefect for Bishops and elevated to Cardinal in 2024, closely assisting Pope Francis, especially during key Church meetings and synods.

Known for his approachable style and commitment to unity, his episcopal motto captures his spirit: "In Illo uno unum" ("In Christ, we are one"). Following Pope Francis, he is the second Pope from the Americas (the first to be born in North America) and the first Augustinian ever to become Pope. "Jesus showed us a model of human holiness that we can all imitate." Pope Leo

Prayer for Pope Leo

O God, who chose your servant, Leo in succession to the Apostle Peter as shepherd of the whole flock, look favourably on the supplications of your people and grant that, as Vicar of Christ on earth, he may confirm his brethren and that the whole Church may be in communion with him in the bond of unity, love and peace, so that in you, the shepherd of souls, all may know the truth and attain life eternal. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Leo XIV's First Homily as Pope

The morning after being elected the 267th Pope, Pope Leo XIV celebrated Mass with the Cardinal electors in the Sistine Chapel, reminding them that "we are to bear witness to our joyful faith in Christ".

He reminded them that without faith, life loses meaning, pointing out that many in the world today reject or misunderstand Christ's message.

Pope Leo acknowledged that faith is often seen as weak or foolish, but he called for Christians to be witnesses of the Gospel, especially in places where it's hard to preach. He highlighted the need for missionary outreach, especially where society has lost sight of faith's value.

He concluded by stressing the importance of humility in leadership, following the example of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, and prayed for the grace to serve in charity as the Successor of Peter.

Remembering Pope Francis ...

Pope Francis



Funeral Homily by Cardinal Re

In Saint Peter's Square, we gather to pray for Pope Francis, sustained by the faith that life continues beyond death. We are very grateful to the dignitaries and faithful who have come to honour him. His final image remains vivid - offering a blessing on Easter Sunday despite severe illness, showing his enduring commitment to his flock.

Pope Francis' pontificate, shaped by his Jesuit formation and pastoral experience in Buenos Aires, was marked by a spirit of service, simplicity, and closeness to the people, particularly the marginalised. His choice of the name Francis symbolised his dedication to humility and care for the poor.

With warmth and informality, Pope Francis addressed the challenges of modern times, preaching the Gospel with clarity and hope amid an "epochal change." Central to his ministry were the themes of mercy, fraternity, and evangelisation, highlighted in documents like *Evangelii Gaudium, Laudato si'*, and *Fratelli tutti*.

His actions for refugees, the poor, and victims of war were countless, with significant journeys to Lampedusa, Lesbos, and Iraq demonstrating his courage and compassion. His message of building bridges, not walls, resonated worldwide.

As a Good Shepherd, Pope Francis gave his life in service, echoing Christ's example. The faithful now commend his soul to God's infinite mercy, asking him to continue blessing the Church and the world from heaven, just as he once did with his final public blessing from Saint Peter's Basilica.

Prayer for Francis

O God, faithful rewarder of souls, grant that your departed servant Pope Francis, whom you made successor of Peter and shepherd of your Church, may happily enjoy for ever in your presence in heaven the mysteries of your grace and compassion, which he faithfully ministered on earth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Eternal rest, grant unto him O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him.

May he rest in peace. Amen.

May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. **Amen.**



Care for the sick and suffering was central to the ministry of Jesus. Jesus told the parable of the Good Samaritan as a way of explaining what it means to be a "neighbour" to another person. The Good Samaritan is someone who sees and is moved to compassion (while others turn away), who draws close, who "binds up wounds", who accompanies the person in need, and who continues to care for as long as it is needed. Often the healing Jesus offered was much more than just a physical cure; it included emotional and spiritual healing as well, because for Jesus, the human person is more than just a body needing to be fixed. Jesus invites us to "Go and do likewise" (Lk. 10:29-37).

The alleviation of suffering is good and must always be part of our focus. But there remains, for many people, a suffering that cannot be taken away and has to be endured. How do we make sense of that? The claim that it is better to die than to suffer leads some people to suggest that euthanasia or assisted suicide might be more compassionate. As Christians, however, we follow Jesus who lived his entire life, including his suffering, in the confident hope that His Father loved him and would raise him up, and He did! The cross, which Jesus did not ask for and did nothing to deserve, has become a sign of hope for countless millions of people in every generation.

The death and resurrection of Jesus leads us to believe that, far from being futile or absurd, a life marked by suffering, when it is lived with generosity and patience, is full of meaning. People like Simon of Cyrene (who helped carry the cross), or St. Veronica (who wiped the face of Jesus) literally accompanied Jesus on the Way of the Cross. Modern saints like Therese of Lisieux and the soon-to-be first millennial saint Carlo Acutis understood that when we unite our suffering with the suffering of Christ for the good of the world, it is transformed through his grace. Most of us have known people like them. Far from being the end of hope, their suffering, when accepted and embraced, has shown itself to be a path to growth and ultimately to Resurrection.

This year's Day for Life is an invitation to pray for those who suffer and to remain with them like the Good Samaritan, bearing witness to their unique and unrepeatable value. We see this closeness in the generous and fruitful service of healthcare professionals, whose mission continues even when there is no longer any prospect of physical healing. We see it in another way in families, carers and chaplains who support their brothers and sisters who are sick or frail or struggling with the many burdens of life. As Christians, we affirm them and hold out to them the hope of Jesus Christ who does not disappoint us.
